- 1st** Fine for planting beans, peppers, cucumbers, melons, and other aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 2nd - 3rd** Seeds planted now tend to rot in ground.
- 4th - 5th** Start seedbeds and flower gardens. Good days for transplanting. Most favorable days for planting beets, onions, turnips, and other root crops where climate allows.
- 6th - 10th** A barren period. Favorable for killing plant pests, cultivating, or taking a short vacation.
- 11th - 12th** Plant flowers. Fine for sowing hay, fodder crops, and grains. Favorable days for planting root crops.
- 13th - 14th** Start seedbeds. Good days for transplanting. Plant carrots, beets, onions, turnips, Irish potatoes, and other root crops in the South.
- 15th - 17th** Do no planting.
- 18th - 19th** Plant sweet corn, beans, peppers, and other aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 20th - 22nd** Barren days. Fine for clearing, plowing, fertilizing, and killing plant pests.
- 23rd - 24th** Extra good for cucumbers, peas, cantaloupes, and other vine crops. Plant peppers, sweet corn, tomatoes, and other aboveground crops in southern Florida, California, and Texas.
- 25th - 27th** A barren period.
- 28th - 29th** Fine for planting beans, peppers, cucumbers, melons, and other aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 30th - 31st** Seeds planted now tend to rot in ground.

- 1st - 3rd** Mainly fair.
- 4th - 7th** Unsettled conditions.
- 8th - 11th** Rainy; wintry mix for northern New Mexico.
- 12th - 15th** Showery/thundery Arkansas/Louisiana, then fair; clearing elsewhere.
- 16th - 19th** Mostly fair skies, then light snow for parts of New Mexico/Texas/Oklahoma; showers Mississippi Valley.
- 20th - 23rd** Showery for Louisiana, then clearing/sharply colder; fair/very cold from Southern Great Plains and points west.
- 24th - 27th** Snow Northern New Mexico; farther south and east, lower New Mexico, Texas and Mississippi Valley get rain.
- 28th - 31st** Fair skies.
